If I have a question or concern about the project, who do I contact?

Reach out to the City of Washburn or the Washburn Area Chamber of Commerce and we will do our best to help.

Where can I cross Bayfield St. to get to the North side of the city? 11th, 8th, 4th & 2nd Ave W. are the designated open cross streets for the duration of the project. Use only these avenues to cross Bayfield St. by car, bike or foot. Open status is subject to change at any time

Where can I park to access businesses on Bayfield St.? Parking for Bayfield St. businesses is available on Omaha St. from 11th Ave W to 3rd Ave W. You cannot park on the detour route. Parking on the avenues is discouraged especially those that are not open as a cross street. You cannot park on the detour route. You can park and drive on the 100 block of Bayfield St. If you are not visiting a business on that street, please use the detour.

What is the speed limit on the detour? The speed limit on the detour is 25 miles per hour. Law enforcement will be monitoring the road.

Can I drive an ATV or UTV on the detour? No, the detour route is not open to ATVs or UTVs.

Road construction and maintenance schedules may vary, leading to updates in the suggested routes.
